Sheila Arnold Inducted in

Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame

Sheila Arnold, a "founding mother" and life member of the York Quilters Guild, was inducted into the Arizona Quilters Hall of Fame on September 22, 2019. The Hall of Fame "celebrates the contribution of Arizonans to quilt making and educating the public about quilt making, its history, and artisans". It is the only state quilters hall of fame in the nation.

Sheila and Boyd moved to Arizona 17 years ago and she soon became involved with quilting activities there. Among other things, Sheila was a traveling teacher for the Arizona Quilters Guild for 10 years, traveling throughout the state to teach and lecture. She served on the AQG board as Traveling Teacher Coordinator for four years. She and Boyd curated a special exhibit of Arizona quilts at the Northwest Quilt Expo in Portland, Oregon in 2014. This involved collecting and cataloging nearly 100 quilts from throughout Arizona, transporting them to Portland, overseeing their hanging at the show, giving docent tours of the Arizona exhibit during the show, and packing up the quilts and returning them after the show. Sheila is a member of the Cholla Chapter of AQG where her primary interest is in making quilts and other items for the many community organizations they support.
