

YQG 2019 Mystery Quilt – Clue 5

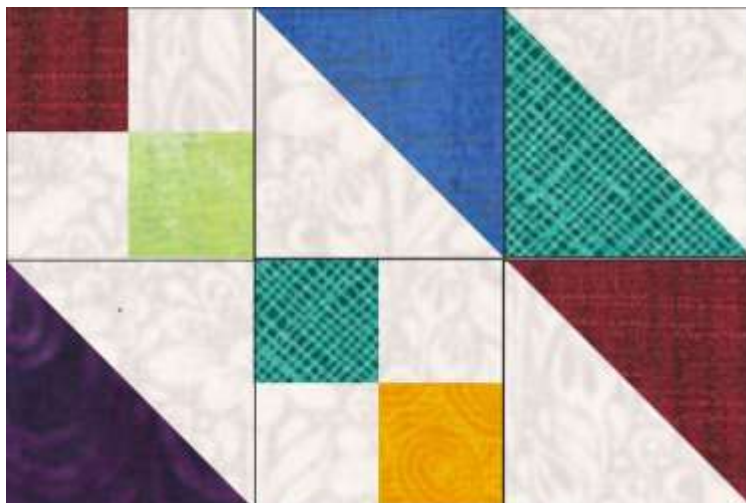
Once you've completed Clue 4, depending on the size you have chosen to make, you should have 20 or 30 units with the four-patch in the center and 40 or 60 units with the four-patch on the left-hand side. The centered-four-patch units look like



and the four-patch-on-left looks like



To the top of each of the centered-four-patch units, attach one four-patch-on-left units above, getting a partial block that looks like:



Because you have pressed the seams away from the four-patches on both strips, the seams should nest nicely to make smooth corners that you can swirl the seams around in pressing. There will, of course, be 20 or 30 of these partial blocks, depending on your choice of size.

You should also now have 20 or 30, depending on the size you are making, of the four-patch-on-left units remaining. Flip each of these units around so that the four patch is now on the right. They should now look like this:



To the bottom of the partial block, sew one of the flipped strips and press as before to get the final block:



You will have 20 or 30 finished blocks. We will assemble these blocks into the final quilt top in Clue 6.
