# Retreat News

Our Fall Retreat is scheduled for Friday, November 21, through Sunday, November 23, 2021. We will be sewing in Meeting Room D, as usual. Check-in time is after 9:30 am on Friday, Check-out is 5:00 pm on Sunday. There is no smoking and no alcohol allowed on campus. Sewing, laughing, and eating are allowed, however, so let's bring it on!

Rooms this fall cost \$220 for a single, \$185/person for a double, and \$160/person for a triple. As usual meals will be provided on Saturday (BLD), and Sunday (BL). You are on your own for lunch and dinner on Friday, so plan to bring your own or go to a restaurant in Carlisle.

## ***September Meeting: English Paper Piecing***

English paper piecing is not just for hexagons—but that's a good way to start. And it's not to be confused with foundation paper piecing which involves sewing the fabric onto the pattern with a sewing machine.

Getting some hands-on experience with EPP at the September Guild meeting.

### **Practice:**

- Glue basting
- Two types of thread basting
- Sewing the pieces together

See examples of Fussy Cutting and the use of other shapes with English paper piecing—the sky's the limit.

Use your finished design to embellish tea towels or to make a group project.

Like the look, but not the process See how to use Inklingo to get precise piecing without the papers.

### **What to bring:**

--Hand sewing tools including pins, thin needles and thimble (we will have some spares on hand)

**If you've done an EPP project, bring it for Show and Tell**

### **REGISTRATION:**

VIA MAIL: Complete form and mail with check, made payable to CQQG. MUST be post-marked by September 1. Upon receipt, a confirmation e-mail will be sent and a Passport with map and locations will be mailed. If Passport doesn't arrive in time, bring your email receipt to any *Tour de Quilt* location to be issued a Passport.

VIA ONLINE:(using credit card or personal pay pal account). Must be submitted by 6 pm on Sept. 10. Bring paid receipt to any location to be issued a Passport. (Locations and map can be found below.)

### **TOUR PASSPORT:**

Each participant needs a passport (or receipt) to enter each location, where it will then be stamped. Your Passport will include a listing of all sites plus a small map.

### **PRIZES:**

Each location will have a prize drawing. To be eligible for a final prize drawing: your Passport must be stamped at all 8 locations and turned in at the final location visited.

### **RAINDATE:**

Sunday, September 12. If postponed due to weather, check back on this website by 9am Saturday and/or Sunday. If the entire weekend is a washout, fee will be converted into 12 tickets for our 2022 raffle quilt.
