

Mystery Table Runner class

We are still planning to hold the Mystery Table Runner class on Friday, October 21. Current plans are to gather in the morning and be ready to start by 10 a.m., work (with a lunch break) until either we finish or 5 p.m. arrives. (This should be more than enough time.) We will learn what materials to bring once we receive the patterns from the source at Quiltwoman.com but we won't know the pattern itself until we open the first envelope of the six steps involved. This is what makes it a "Mystery"! All we know at present is that we will need five fabrics and it should take us somewhere between 3 and 4 hours to complete a top for a table runner. The pattern chosen is rated as "advanced beginner", so it should be a good experience for someone wanting to increase their skills. We have room for four more people so please consider joining us. We will have a sign-up sheet at the August meeting.

GUIDELINES FOR MAKING QUILTS FOR KIDS

Do's:

Minimum size is 35"x45". Patterns that would appeal to infants, children and teens are acceptable. Please use new 100% cotton fabrics.

Quilting should be at least 2" apart. Use low loft cotton, poly or an 80/20 combination batting

Bindings should be completely sewn by machine. A favorite method is to attach the binding to the back of the quilt. Bring around to the front, and edge stitch the binding down. Straight stitching, zig zag or decorative stitches can be used.

Attach a label to the lower back by sewing around all four edges. Write your first name on the label. Can also include York PA. Use a fine tip permanent marker.

Please wash your quilts in detergent without softeners or perfumes.

Don'ts:

Rag quilts are not a good choice.

Hand quilting or tied quilts will not hold up well.

Fleece may cause problems with static electricity.

Invisible thread can melt in hot dryers

No embellishments of buttons, long strings, sequins, rhinestones etc. due to choking hazards.

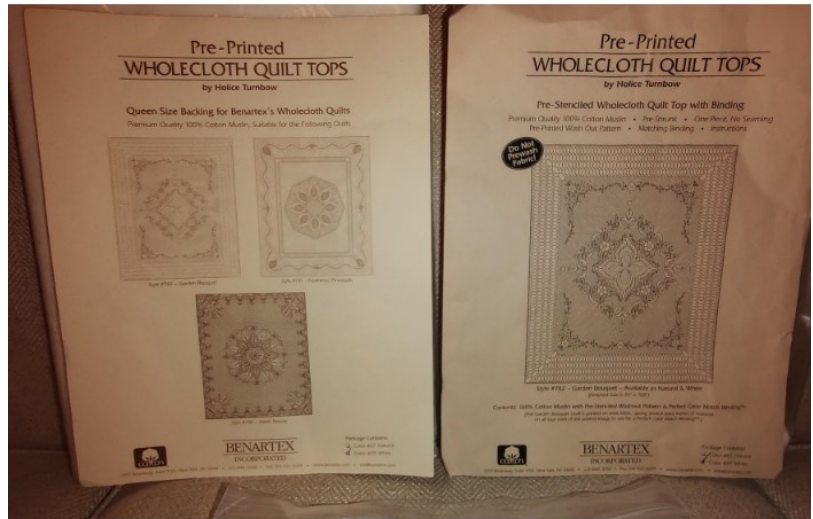
